WHY POVERTY?

We believe that poverty is closely related to economic growth of a country. When graduate student of economic in Universitas Indonesia is asked about what are issues that related to poverty they answered crime, illness, sanitation, hunger, unemployment, uneducated people, poor agriculture, corruption, but none of them answer economic growth. Because our sense always relate poverty to injustice, human rights, inequality, or immorality. But if we take a look more closely to the issues mentioned, we will see that poverty is actually related to the economic growth of a country.

We simplify all issues that have been mentioned earlier into four specific problems that could lead us into innovation. First is health or nutrition problem, second is education problem, third is source of financial inclusiveness, and the last but not the least is social entrepreneurship.

HEALTH

Basic health needs must be addressed first and foremost because sick people cannot work; and parents with sick children have to worry about their children's well-being. Having good health allows people to progress to livelihood development schemes. Once the people are in good health and able to work, they could become a fully function member of society and of course they increase their quality. With a high quality of human resource, higher economic growth could be achieved.

INNOVATION: Raskin (Grant based - Indonesia), Lucky Fish (Cambodia)

EDUCATION

When each family can earn sufficient income since they are healthier, education becomes the main focus as the key to unlocking opportunities for the next generations. Education includes both formal education in school and vocational trainings to prepare the locals to be committed, resourceful leaders. Formal education fosters both academic excellence and extra-curricular activities to increase the schoolchildren's confidence and creativity. There are also informal education schemes which encourage learning by doing, and provide on-the-job skills training in areas like farming and husbandry. Once again better education could lead to better quality of human resource and once again it could support the economic growth.

FINANCIALINCLUSIVENESS

Source of financial is another issue that should be addressed seriously, because some people do not have the opportunity as other in term of financial source. Let's take a look at the agricultural credit availability, or we could say unavailability. Agriculture is closely related to weather and climate, and weather and climate cycle is two of things that have a high degree in term of predictability, and farmer has to suffer with that matter. In addition financial and banking system do not support farmer in facing its problem, because Bank is for profit organization, and by that of course banks prefer sectors that has a high profitability and unfortunately agriculture is not included on the group. Unleash there is no innovation that could help farmer; it could become an intergenerational poverty. And intergenerational poverty could create uneducated and bad health condition people, which of course lead to lower human resource quality, and at the end lower economic growth.

SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP

The common business that operated today is profit oriented, because for some people profit or money is the reason why they started business in the first place. But actually it does not necessarily true, because other people value human rights or compassion over money, and they call it social entrepreneurship. The social entrepreneurship is intended to solve social problem, it includes poverty, there is so many way to conduct social entrepreneurship, creativity is one of the most important catalyst that help entrepreneurs solve social problem, The more social entrepreneurship, the less poverty, and the better a country will be.

CONCEPT & OUTPUT


